

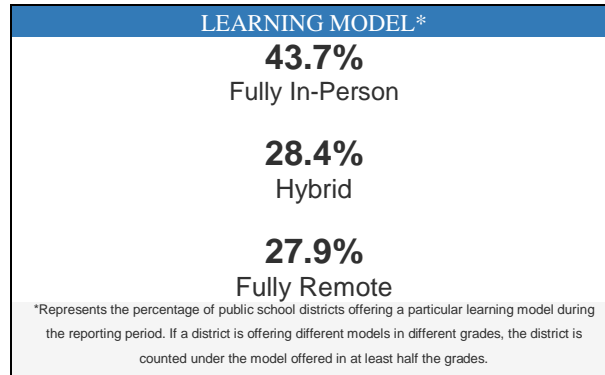


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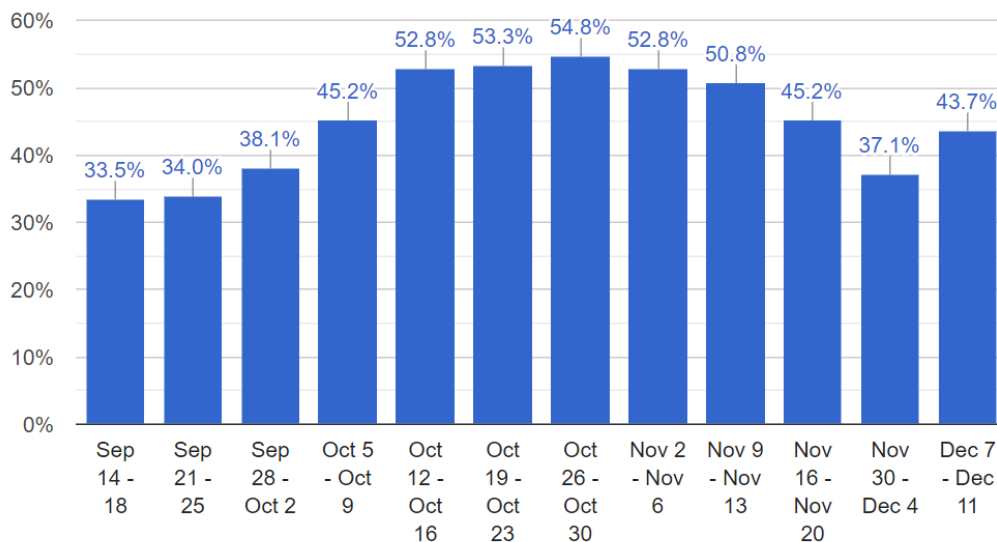
Supporting Student Participation in 2020-21 School Learning Model¹ Week of December 7 – 11

A fully in-person learning model was the predominant model offered in 43.7 percent (N=86) of public school districts while a hybrid model was the predominant model offered in 28.4 percent (N=56) of public school districts. For this week, a fully remote model was the predominant model in 27.9% (N=55) of all public school districts.



The percentage of districts offering a predominantly “fully in-person” learning model increased last week to 43.7% (N=86) but still lower than the high of 54.8% (N=108) for the week of October 26-30.
