



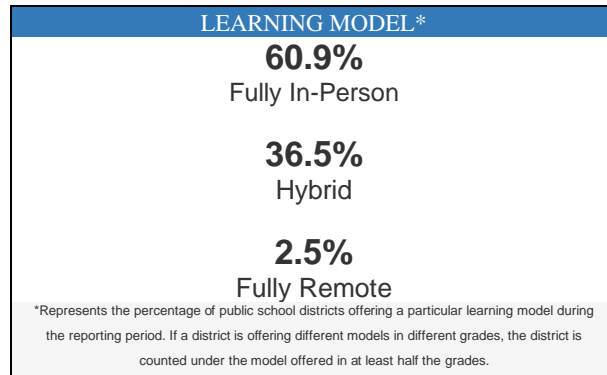
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# Supporting Student Participation in 2020-21 School Learning Model<sup>1</sup>

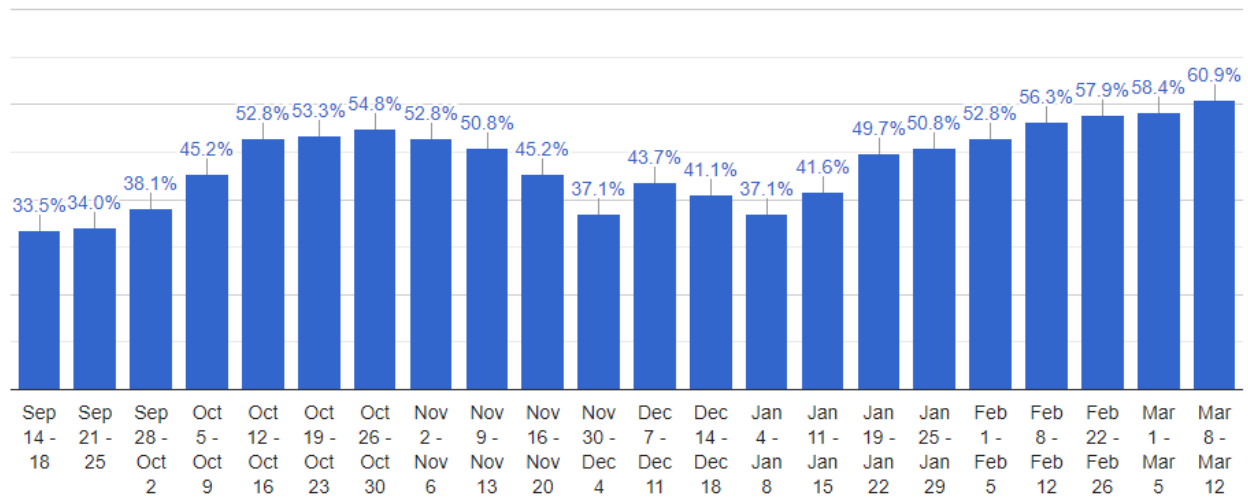
Week of March 8 - 12

A fully in-person learning model was the predominant model offered in 60.9 percent (N=120) of public school districts while a hybrid model was the predominant model offered in 36.5 percent (N=72) of public school districts. For this week, a fully remote model was the predominant model in 2.5% (N=5) of all public school districts.



The percentage of districts offering a predominantly “fully in-person” learning model increased last week to its highest level ever at 60.9 percent (N=120).
