



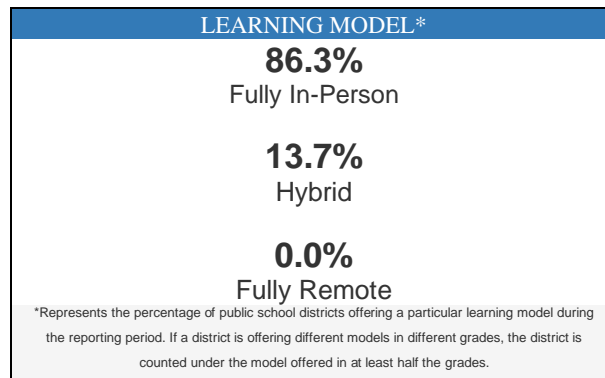
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Supporting Student Participation in 2020-21 School Learning Model¹

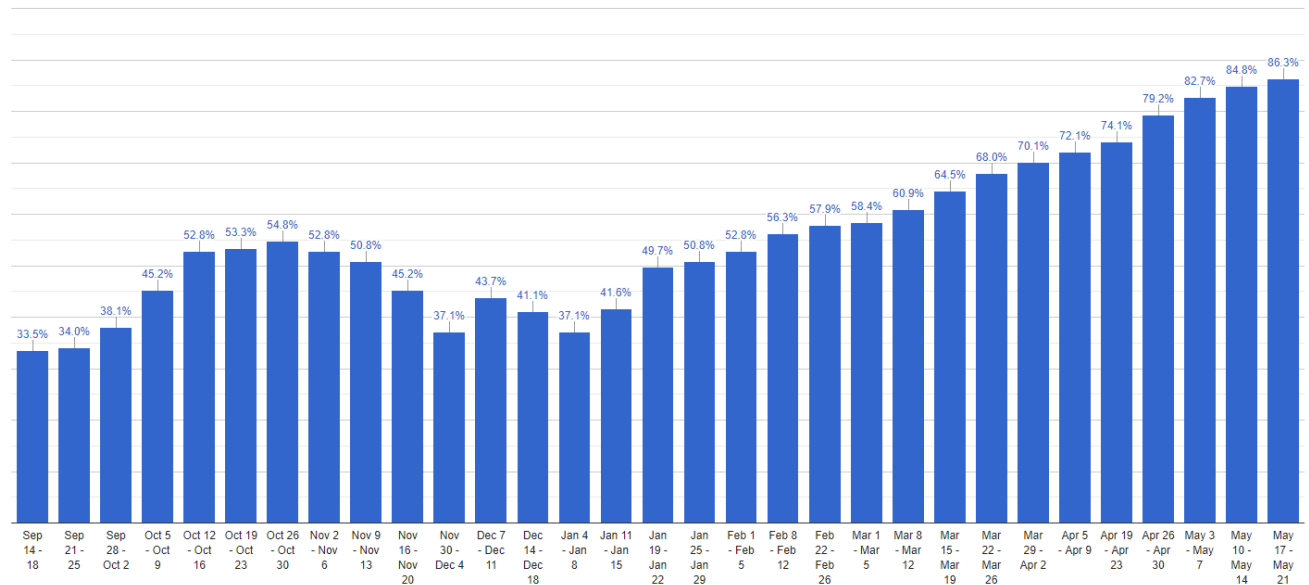
Week of May 17 – 21

A fully in-person learning model was the predominant model offered in 86.3 percent (N=170) of public school districts while a hybrid model was the predominant model offered in 13.7 percent (N=27) of public school districts. No school district was operating in a fully remote model.



The percentage of districts offering a predominantly “fully in-person” learning model increased last week to its highest level ever at 86.3 percent (N=170).
