Next Generation Accountability Dashboard-Report Notes

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Overview

Connecticut's Next Generation Accountability System is a broad set of 12 indicators that help tell the story of how well a school is preparing its students for success in college, careers and life. It provides a holistic, multifactor perspective of district and school performance. Districts/schools earn points on a broad set of 12 indicators (achievement, growth, chronic absenteeism, college and career readiness, high school graduation, postsecondary entrance, physical fitness, and the arts). Performance on each indicator is measured against a target. Student group performance receives additional weight in the system. The Accountability Index is the percentage of points earned across all available indicators.

This report allows users to generate visual representations of performance on <u>next generation</u> <u>accountability indicators</u> across years, districts, and schools. Comparison with state performance is also available. Users can generate and export a data table with trend data for all next generation indicators.

How to Use this Report

Users can view visual representations of performance on accountability indicators by navigating through the tabs shown below. The Indicator (Ind.) and Accountability tabs contain line charts. The Trend Crosstab (Export) tab includes data in a tabular format that can be exported to Excel.

On tabs where more than one metric is included (e.g., Indicator 1 consists of 6 separate metrics), buttons are included that allow the user to toggle on and off metrics in the line chart as shown below.

When all buttons are colored, all metrics are shown in the line chart. The colors of the buttons correspond to the color of the line for the metric.




When a user deselects one or more metrics, only those that are colored are shown in the chart. This was done in an effort to make the chart more customizable and allow for easier viewing.

While the default for this report shows state-level data, users can customize which district(s)/school(s) and years are displayed in the charts and crosstab by using the lists on the screen as shown below.

Important Notes:

- To view district-level data on the chart or crosstab, a user must select the district name from the District(s) list and select District-level from the School(s) list.
- When more than one district or school is selected, the chart will be divided into lattice columns to display the data. The associated district and school selections are shown below the lattice columns.

A user can export a data table from the Trend Crosstab (Export) tab by clicking the *Export to Excel* button. At any time, a user can refresh the web page in order to return the report to its default state.

Current sources include State assessment data files, Public School Information System (PSIS) Registration and Collections, Teacher Course Student, SAT/AP from College Board, ACT from ACT, Inc., IB from International Baccalaureate Organization, and dual enrollment data from the University of Connecticut, the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities (CSCU), and participating private colleges and universities, National Student Clearinghouse, The Connecticut School Data Report (ED165). Data for this report are updated annually when all available indicator data have been collected and calculations have been completed. This typically occurs in the fall.
