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Overview

This report provides the number and percentage of all K-12 students with disabilities (including students with Services Plans) attending an educational setting other than the district's schools. This metric reflects only students with disabilities for whom the district is fiscally responsible. Descriptions of each setting category are provided in the <u>terms/definitions</u> table below.

How to Use this Report

The toggle button at the top of the report allows users to navigate between state- and district-level results.

The state-level page provides a table and graph of the data. Users can view all school years or select a subset of school years using the School Years dropdown.

The district-level page provides only a data table. In addition to filtering by year, users can also filter the data table by district, using the Districts dropdown.

Data can be exported to Excel using the EXPORT TO EXCEL button.

Inclusion/Exclusion Rules

Calculations are based on all students with disabilities for whom the district is fiscally responsible, including both students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and students with a Services Plan (SP).

Federal law requires that students with disabilities be educated with their nondisabled peers as much as is appropriate. Placement in private schools or other settings tends to reduce the chances of students with disabilities interacting with nondisabled peers, and of receiving the same education.

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
