Suspension Rate Report-Report Notes

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Overview

Suspension Rate equals the number of students reported with at least one suspension (inschool or out-ofschool) or expulsion in ED166 Student Disciplinary Offense Data Collection divided by the unduplicated student enrollment count for the school or district across the October, January (until 2016) and June PSIS Collections for the given school year.

When a filter, or student group, is selected, the Suspension Rate equals the number of students in that student group reported with at least one suspension (in-school or out-of-school) or expulsion in ED166 Student Disciplinary Offense Data Collection divided by the unduplicated student enrollment count for that particular student group.

How to Use this Report

Use the dropdown options for year, district, schools, and filter by to customize the on-screen output table. **You must click the "Submit" button to generate output.**

For example, if you wish to view trend data (most recent five years) for all districts and all schools disaggregated by gender, you would select Year = Trend, District = All Districts, Schools = All Schools, Filter By = Gender, and click the "Submit" button. **Export** your results by clicking the "Export .csv file" link below the report title.

Inclusion/Exclusion Rules

The denominator for suspension rate is calculated using data from all PSIS collections in a given year. Therefore, the denominator may not match the enrollment number on the EdSight enrollment report which is based only on the October PSIS collection.

This report excludes students in prekindergarten.
