

Classroom Teacher Attendance- Report Notes

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Overview

This report provides the average number of full-time equivalent (FTE) days absent for classroom teachers due to illness or personal time. Absences of 10 consecutive days or more are not counted if the teacher was replaced by an instructor fully certified for the position.

How to Use this Report

This report can be adjusted using the Year, District, and School dropdowns. To see statewide data, select State of Connecticut from the District dropdown menu. Export the results to a .csv file by clicking “**Export .csv file**”.

Inclusion/Exclusion Rules

- Absences of 10 consecutive days or more are not counted if the teacher was replaced by an educator fully certified for the position.
- Absence data are only collected for Classroom Teachers.
- For 2019-20, Classroom Teacher Absences are limited to those absences until the mid-March shutdown. This will impact the comparability of the averages.

Terms/Definitions

- **Average FTE Days Absent:** The average number of full-time equivalent (FTE) days classroom teachers are absent due to illness or personal time.
- **Classroom Teachers:** Certified professionals who provide direct instructional services to pupils, including full-time and part-time educators serving as kindergarten, elementary, art, music, physical education, English, world language, mathematics, reading, health, science, social studies, vocational education, bilingual, English as a second language, remedial reading or mathematics, gifted and talented, and special education except speech and hearing.
